The HCC Ag Club visited the Monsanto campus in St. Louis, Missouri in November, 2015. They were given a guided tour of the research facility where they were educated firsthand how the company is committed to agriculture.

The Ag club also travelled to Memphis, TN, in November to visit Agricenter International. The Agricenter International Research Farm is a self-sustaining, not-for-profit Organization that provides economic development and improved quality of life by facilitating agricultural research, educational programs, environmental conservation, natural area preservation, and recreational opportunities. The students were given a tour through the row crop research farm.





While in Memphis the club spent some leisurely time inside Bass Pro Shops at the Pyramid. The Pyramid is one of the largest retail stores in the world and features an interactive wetlands educational museum, as well as a cypress swamp waterfowl habitat, to include an 84,000 gallon alligator habitat.
